

Job 9:1-2, 5-12, 32-35; 10:2-12

Then Job answered:

² 'Indeed I know that this is so; but how can a mortal be just before God?
he who removes mountains, and they do not know it, when he overturns them
in his anger;
⁶ who shakes the earth out of its place, and its pillars tremble;
⁷ who commands the sun, and it does not rise; who seals up the stars;
⁸ who alone stretched out the heavens and trampled the waves of the Sea;
⁹ who made the Bear and Orion, the Pleiades and the chambers of the south;
¹⁰ who does great things beyond understanding, and marvellous things without
number.
¹¹ Look, he passes by me, and I do not see him; he moves on, but I do not
perceive him.
¹² He snatches away; who can stop him? Who will say to him, "What are you
doing?"
For he is not a mortal, as I am, that I might answer him, that we should come
to trial together.
³³ There is no umpire between us, who might lay his hand on us both.
³⁴ If he would take his rod away from me, and not let dread of him terrify me,
³⁵ then I would speak without fear of him, for I know I am not what I am
thought to be
I will say to God, Do not condemn me; let me know why you contend against
me.
³ Does it seem good to you to oppress, to despise the work of your hands and
favour the schemes of the wicked?
⁴ Do you have eyes of flesh? Do you see as humans see?
⁵ Are your days like the days of mortals, or your years like human years,
⁶ that you seek out my iniquity and search for my sin,
⁷ although you know that I am not guilty, and there is no one to deliver out of
your hand?
⁸ Your hands fashioned and made me; and now you turn and destroy me.
⁹ Remember that you fashioned me like clay; and will you turn me to dust
again?
¹⁰ Did you not pour me out like milk and curdle me like cheese?
¹¹ You clothed me with skin and flesh, and knit me together with bones and
sinews.
¹² You have granted me life and steadfast love, and your care has preserved my
spirit.

Romans 1:1-7

Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, ² which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy scriptures, ³ the gospel concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh ⁴ and was declared to be Son of God with power according to the spirit of holiness by resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord, ⁵ through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith among all the Gentiles for the sake of his name, ⁶ including yourselves who are called to belong to Jesus Christ,

⁷ To all God’s beloved in Rome, who are called to be saints:

John 1:14-18

¹⁴ And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father’s only son, full of grace and truth. ¹⁵ (John testified to him and cried out, ‘This was he of whom I said, “He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.”’) ¹⁶ From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. ¹⁷ The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. ¹⁸ No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father’s heart, who has made him known.
